Dementia and the Role of Occupational Therapy. Download a printable copy here. Dementia results from impaired cognition, due to damage to the brain. The majority of dementia cases (60% to 80%) are classified as Alzheimer's disease (Alzheimer's Association, n.d.). The signs of dementia generally include, but are not limited to, decreased short-term memory, decreased problem-solving skills, decreased perceptual skills, problems with communication and language, and personality changes.

Dementia and the Role of Occupational Therapy - AOTA

Occupational therapists are uniquely qualified to systematically assess the cognitive functioning of persons with dementia, caregivers, and home environments and to integrate this information to derive and implement activities tailored to the person's capacities and context, thereby reducing neuropsychiatric behaviors and increasing engagement in meaningful activity.

Occupational therapy practitioners, through their academic curricula, expertise in activity analysis, and work with older people in various settings, approach dementia as a condition that affects occupational performance.

Results: After working with an occupational therapist for eight sessions, the person with dementia's engagement in activity increased by 50% and his frequency of vocal disturbance decreased, and the caregiver felt more confident in using activities with her father.

Tailored Activities to Reduce Neuropsychiatric Behaviors ...

Most of the information about activity analysis is contained in occupational therapy textbooks. A perusal of the American Occupational Therapy Association's Evidence Exchange database reveals lists of research articles that target specific treatment modalities and therapeutic activities, but none that focus on activity analysis itself.
