Although the term "Sovereignty" is modern yet the idea of "Sovereignty" goes back to Aristotle who spoke of the "supreme power of the state". Throughout the middle Ages the Roman jurists and the civilians kept this idea in their mind and frequently employed the terms "Summa" potestas and "Plenitudo potestatis" to designate the supreme power of the state.
