The Federal Rules of Civil Procedure (eff. Dec. 1, 2019) govern civil proceedings in the United States district courts. Their purpose is "to secure the just, speedy, and inexpensive determination of every action and proceeding." Fed. R. Civ. P. 1. The rules were first adopted by order of the Supreme Court on December 20, 1937, transmitted to Congress on January 3, 1938, and effective September ...

US Federal District Courts Case Law Sometimes referred to as the "work horses" of the federal courts, the US Federal District Courts hear both civil and criminal federal cases on the trial level. Established by Congress, the courts are broken down into 89 districts within the fifty states along with six more that include various US territories.

Judges are obviously human beings, and human beings can only work so many hours a day. To be sure, federal appellate judges have staffs of clerks and assistants to help them, and many courts also employ large groups of attorneys, called staff attorneys, who process the more routine cases and present them in truncated form to the judges.

The trial is a structured process where the facts of a case are presented to a jury, and they decide if the defendant is guilty or not guilty of the charge offered. During trial, the prosecutor uses witnesses and evidence to prove to the jury that the defendant committed the crime(s).

Most federal criminal cases never go to trial. Instead, they end with a formal plea bargain between the defendant and the U.S. Attorney's office. The defendant agrees to plead guilty and in exchange the prosecution agrees to either drop some charges or agrees to recommend a shorter sentence for the defendant.
